Bylaw Changes for 2022-2023 (UPDATED)

Article VI, Page 31, section 3: **District chairs shall be elected by each district in April. If there is more than one (2) nominee for district chair, a vote will be taken by written ballot. District Chairs, duly elected by their district, will be recognized at the annual meeting. In the event of a catastrophic situation (i.e., pandemic, tornado, flood, ice storm, etc.) the district may conduct the election by mail, phone, or email.**

Article VI, Page 31, section 7: All officers **must be a paid member of an auxiliary in good standing with AHAA** and shall be elected to serve for a term of one (1) year. Officers other than the president-elect may be re-elected for an additional term of one(1) year in the same office. After election for two (2) successive years to the same office, re-election to that office is barred for the period of one (1) year.

Article VI, Page 31, section 10: Past presidents of AHAA are barred from serving in an elected office, but may serve in appointed positions and/or may be appointed to complete the term of an elected officer. **They may serve as district treasurer or secretary, but not elected to the district chair position.**

Article VII, Page 32, section 1, letter e: **Visits each district.** In the event of a catastrophic situation (i.e., pandemic, tornado, flood, ice storm, etc.) the district **meeting** may be canceled by the executive committee.

Article VII, Page 32, section 2, letter g: **Sets the dates for the district meetings.**

Article VII, Page 33, section 2, letter f: **Visits each district at least once**, unless they are canceled by the executive committee as stated in Article VII, Section1, letter e.

Article VII, Page 34, section 6, letter d: **The person running for district chair shall submit the proper form to the chair of the credentials committee before March 15th.**

Article VII, Page 34, Section 6, letter e: **Conduct district meeting as scheduled by the President-elect unless canceled by the executive committee as stated in Article VII, Section 1, letter e.**

Article VIII, Page 34, section 1: The Board of directors shall consist of the elected officers, the district chairs, the president of the AHA or his/**her** representative, the president of the Arkansas Society of Directors of Volunteer Services and the immediate past president of the AHAA.

Administrative Policies and Procedures

Under Expense Allowances, Page 42, section 13: New AHAA Policy for Outstanding Checks

When the Treasurer is reconciling the bank statement at the end of each month, if there is a check that is thirty or more days outstanding, the Treasurer will contact the recipient concerning the check.

If the recipient has not received the check, in what should be a reasonable amount of time, the Treasurer will void the "lost" check in the check register and issue the recipient another check. If the "lost" check is over \$100.00, the Treasurer may put a stop payment on the "lost" check with the bank.

If the recipient has received the check, the Treasurer will encourage the recipient to deposit or cash it.

If there is a check that is sixty or more days outstanding, the Treasurer will contact the recipient to encourage them to deposit or cash the check and advise the recipient that after ninety days, the check will be considered void.

Any check that is ninety or more days outstanding, and the Treasurer has taken the above steps, the Treasurer may put a stop payment with the bank on that check and void the check in the check register.

The second annual “Be a Part of the Cure” Walk honoring all Arkansas cancer patients, cancer survivors and remembering those who have passed away, was held at War Memorial Stadium and on the outdoor walking path around it on April 30. Over 1,000 participants registered for the walk and it raised \$242,000 for cancer research, more than doubling the numbers from the first walk in 2021. Liz Birrer chaired the event and the WPRCI Auxiliary co-chaired. Danyelle Musselman, a WPRCI Board of Advisors member and wife of Arkansas Men’s Basketball Coach Eric Musselman, was the emcee of the event. Hickingbotham Investments is the founding sponsor of the walk. Supporting sponsors included Baptist Health, Highlands Oncology and Astra Zeneca, along with 50 other organizations and businesses. Next year’s Be A Part of the Cure Walk is set for May 6, 2023.

On May 12, Dr. Cam Patterson, UAMS Chancellor, was finally celebrated as the 2021 WPRCI Auxiliary Distinguished Honoree with more than 60 guests enjoying a lovely reception at the home of Stuart Cobb.

Once again, due to covid/infection control, the Auxiliary was unable to host the annual breakfast in honor of the Cancer Institute staff. Instead, Happy Face cookies were distributed to all employees with our thanks and the message that we expect to be able to host the breakfast in March of 2023.

The Partners Card 2022 committee is well underway working with merchants, sponsors and sellers. The 2022 Partners Card dates are October 28 – November 6. Partners Card proceeds support the mission of the auxiliary through grants.
